

RULES FOR SUCCEEDING IN ARMY JROTC

- Live by the *Cadet Honor Code*: "A cadet will NOT lie, cheat or steal." This is the same honor code adopted by the United States service academies and other military colleges across the country. Remember, HONOR and INTEGRITY are leadership values.
- Cadets WILL wear the cadet uniform once a week on a designated day set on the *Training Schedule*. Class participation, including proper wear of the uniform, will constitute 20 percent of each term's grade. See your *Cadet Reference* on how to wear the uniform properly.
- Uniform will be clean and pressed.
- Shoes and brass will be shined.
- Insignia and rank will be worn in the proper place.
- The wearing of a wristwatch, identification wrist bracelet, and no more than two rings are authorized with the Cadet uniform. The style of these must be conservative and in good taste. The wear of a religious medal is also authorized, provided neither the medal nor the chain is exposed.
- Military headgear (berets, garrison caps and ACU caps) will be worn while in uniform and outside.
- Grooming while IN UNIFORM:
 - Male Cadets
 - a) The hair will be neatly groomed so as not to present a ragged or unkempt appearance. The length and bulk of the hair will not interfere with the normal wear of the uniform or headgear. No hair "fads" are permitted (including unnatural hair color). Sideburns, if worn, will not be flared, and will not extend lower than lowest part of the external ear opening. The bottom of the sideburn will be clean-shaven and horizontal.
 - b) The face will be clean-shaven, except that a mustache is permitted. If worn, the mustache will be kept neatly trimmed, tapered, and will not present a chopped off appearance. No portion of the mustache will cover the upper lip line or extend horizontally beyond or below the corner points of the mouth. Handlebar mustaches, beards, or goatees are NOT authorized while in uniform.
 - c) Males will NOT wear earrings, nose rings, eyebrow rings or studs, or any other body piercing jewelry while in uniform.
 - Female Cadets
 - a) The bulk, style, and length of the hair will not interfere with the wear of the uniform or headgear. Hair will be kept groomed and will not present a ragged, or unkempt appearance. Hair will not extend below the bottom edge of the collar and should not be cut so short as to appear unfeminine. Hair-holding ornaments (e.g. barrettes, pins, and clips) must be of natural color or transparent and be inconspicuously placed. No hair "fads" (including unnatural hair color) are permitted. Makeup and nail polish will be conservative and complement the uniform.

- b) Females may wear small earrings while in Class A and Class B uniforms. They may be clip-on, screw-on, or post-type) in gold, silver, white pearl, or diamond, and worn on the ear lobe.. They cannot exceed more than 1/4 inch in diameter, and must be unadorned and spherical. No other body rings of any type (eyebrow, upper ear, nose rings, eyebrow rings or studs are permitted while in uniform. No earrings may be worn in Class C (ACU uniform).
- Cadets will follow all school rules without question. In-house suspension will be cause to reduce a cadet one rank. Out-of-school suspension will cause a cadet to be reduced two ranks. Any suspension may be cause for JROTC Cadet Leadership Challenge (JCLC) disqualification.
- Cadets will meet all obligations (e.g., homework, financial, etc.)
- Cadets will be respectful of faculty and other students at Brockton High School. They will show proper military courtesy to cadets of higher rank during JROTC classes and other JROTC activities. They will render appropriate military courtesy to the SAI, AI and other members of the U.S. Armed Forces at all times.
- Cadets will address commissioned officers, warrant officers and cadet officers as Sir or Ma'am, depending on gender.
- Cadets will address non-commissioned officers of the Armed Forces (at all times) and cadet NCOs (during JROTC activities) by the appropriate title (i.e. cadet, private, corporal, sergeant, first sergeant or sergeant major).
- The first time the SAI or commissioned officer of higher rank enters the classroom in a class period, the first cadet that recognizes him will call "attention." All cadets will remain at the position of attention until directed to "carry on". "Attention" will NOT be called after class instruction has begun.
- If the SAI or other commissioned officer of the Armed Forces is not in the room, the first time the AI enters the classroom in a given class period, the first cadet that recognizes him will call "at ease". All cadets will remain quiet until directed to "carry on". "At ease" will NOT be called after class instruction has begun.
- If the SAI or AI is not in the classroom, the first time a cadet officer enters the classroom on a given day, the first cadet that recognizes him/her will call at ease. All cadets will remain quiet until directed to "carry on"
- When cadets enter a JROTC classroom they will remain standing behind their chairs until directed to take their seats.
- All cadets will stand for the *Pledge of Allegiance* every morning during Registration Room.
 - When not in uniform, cadets will face the flag, stand at attention with their right hand held over their heart.
 - When in uniform, cadets will stand at the position of attention (hands to their sides) facing the flag.
- Cadets will render appropriate honors and respect when the American Flag is displayed and during the playing of the *National Anthem*.
- Cadets will have something to write with and write on while in class.

- Cadets will bring appropriate materials to class (e.g., *Cadet Reference, journals*) according to instructions on the weekly *Training Schedule*.
- Cadets will always knock on the door and be recognized before entering the JROTC office (Room Y-128).

I have read, understand and agree to abide by the *Rules for Succeeding in Army JROTC*, to include wearing the JROTC uniform once a week. I also understand that not complying with these rules may have an adverse impact on my grade, my rank in the Corps of Cadets and/or may result in dismissal from the Brockton High School Army Junior ROTC Program without credit.
